Overview of Conferences

These conferences are held at prestigious institutions, providing our students with enriching experiences as they compete, collaborate, and learn from peers across the globe. Some notable conferences include:

- National High School MUN (NHSMUN) in New York City, hosted at the United Nations Headquarters, offering students a prestigious experience and access to UN speakers.
- Harvard Model United Nations (HMUN), which brings together thousands of students from around the world and is held at the historic Harvard University campus.
- The Hague International Model United Nations (THIMUN) in the Netherlands, one of the most renowned MUN conferences globally, held at the World Forum Convention Center and recognized for its high standards of debate and international attendance.
- Global Classrooms International Middle School MUN Conference held at the United Nations Headquarters and attended by middle school students from around the world, providing younger delegates a valuable, age-appropriate experience in MUN.

Local and Regional Conferences

Before attending major conferences, our students could build skills and gain experience closer to home, often hosted by nearby colleges and universities.
